



# Food for Thought on Language Diversity

#### A.S Bohashem's Refined Proposal:

- Eritrean constitutions of 1952 and 1997 on Languages?
- All Eritrean Languages have equal constitutional status as national languages
- All Eritreans have Equal Rights to Use any Eritrean language at local and national levels, in public and private spheres
- Formally recognise English as the Working Language in Eritrea since 1941
